#### **Cafeteria Catholics**



I was chatting with a colleague (another Catholic) at work. We were discussing potential candidates for our next Pope, prior to

the recent election of Pope Leo XIV. My colleague was from Toronto so I mentioned that I would be very pleased if Cardinal Leo of Toronto were, despite his age, elected. My colleague grimaced and, while agreeing that Cardinal Leo had many tremendous attributes,



commented that he disapproved of some of Cardinal Leo's conservative views, citing specifically Cardinal Leo's opposition to birth control in Africa.

My colleague disliked Cardinal Leo's position because of the AIDs epidemic. I was very surprised by this comment. This colleague professed to be a practicing Catholic and yet stood in opposition, public opposition, to Church teaching. As Knights, and as Catholic men, we are called to accept, follow and spread the teachings of Christ which are explained to and for us by the Catholic Church. In my opinion, it is acceptable for us to wish the Church did things differently (as Knights we pray for the canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney, but to date, that has not happened) but to follow the Church's teachings faithfully, even if the Church doesn't listen to our wishes.

An incredible study in contrasts in this area is the comparison between St. Francis and Martin Luther. Both wanted things from the Church. St Francis wanted Pope Innocent to approve his Order. Initially St. Francis was rebuffed. He obeyed. Ultimately, Pope Innocent approved the Franciscans.



On the other hand, as everyone knows, **Martin Luther had grievances with the Catholic Church, which led to his writing his 95 Theses.** Pope Leo X ordered Luther to renounce his writings but, despite his vows at ordination, **Luther refused**, leading to the Protestant Reformation. For good measure Luther removed 7 books from the Bible just because he could (this latter

point is not really relevant to my musings today, I just find it incredible that millions of people are deprived of 7 books of Holy Scripture just because some guy got rid of them-and they think Catholics are going to hell-but that is the subject for another day.)

The First Reading from May 17, Acts 13.44-52 shows the harm that that lay people can do to the Catholic Church. (In that reading, the leading Jews of the city drove Paul and Barbabas out of the city) There is great power in the laity. Used improperly, it does the work of Satan.

Let us, as Knights and Catholics imitate St. Francis, not Martin Luther, and follow and build up the teachings of the Church, not just the ones we like, whether our disagreement is on birth control in Africa, abortion, the exclusivity of the two sexes, sex outside marriage (which is any sex outside a marriage in the Catholic Church whether heterosexual or homosexual) and the list does actually go on.



To paraphrase a quote of St. Augustine, if we follow the teachings of the Church that we like, and ignore the ones we don't like, we are not following the Church, we are following ourselves. We are, in effect, Cafeteria Catholics, going down the line of teachings and picking what we like and leaving what we don't. Perhaps the world has always been this way, but it seems to me that we live in an age when everyone thinks they know better than anyone else. I'll leave the issue of whether or not this is correct when it comes to governments, but when it comes to the Catholic Church, as Knights and as Catholics we must absolutely get rid of that mindset and follow the Church's teachings.

I'm embarrassed to say that not that many years ago, I was unaware of many of the Church's teachings-my bad. I am rectifying that and doing my best to follow the example of St. Francis, not Martin Luther.
