I was delighted and honoured when asked if I would write about our featured member, Mary Herlick. Although I have known Mary for around 20 years, there were things about her that I didn't know. What I did know, however, was that she is a kind, compassionate, and giving individual who epitomizes what it means to be a CWL member.

Mary is the youngest of five children, spending her earliest years in the Owen Sound and Simcoe area. Like many of us, her mother was a CWL member and a wonderful faith role model for her. Her family moved to London when she was three. She attended St. Michael's Elementary School and then Catholic Central High School.

Mary was wed to Rob 35 years ago. Several years later they were blessed with twins, Katie and Eddie, born three months premature. Six weeks after birth, Eddie developed sepsis, and the medical team wasn't sure if he would survive. Faced with this devastating situation, Mary turned to prayer and when she got to the words, "Thy will be done," in the Our Father, she knew that she had to give it up to God. That moment changed her life and deepened her faith. The children were discharged from hospital three months after they were born and shortly thereafter, Eddie was diagnosed with cerebral palsy. Even with his special needs and maybe because of them, Eddie was a gift to all who knew him. He passed at the age of 14. Katie prospered and currently resides in Vancouver where she works and is engaged to be married. She is a remarkable young woman and continues to be a blessing to Mary and Rob.

Mary worked for many years as a medical transcriptionist and then several years after as an office administrator in a doctor's office. She retired in 2023 and had no difficulty filling her time with her many hobbies and interests. Mary has always loved music and joined the 10:00 a.m. Mass Choir at St. Michael's in 2016. She is also a faithful member of the SMUGlees ukulele group. She enjoys gardening, yoga, board games, and cards and recently joined a fitness class two days a week focusing on cardio and core strengthening. Walking with friends and reading and discussing books with her Book Club, bring her great pleasure.

Mary has been an active member of St. Michael's parish most of her life. In addition to singing in the choir, she is a Eucharistic Minister and was a Marriage Prep leader for many years. She has also been a member of the CWL for over 25 years participating in bake sales, the Project Hope Sandwich brigade, SMUGlees, and more recently, the Christmas Market. As an organization, the CWL is truly blessed to count Mary among their number, and I look forward to knowing her for many years to come.

# Finding Hope in the Fight Against

On Tuesday, January 21st, the CWL National presented the webinar, "Finding Hope in the Fight Against Human Trafficking". The webinar began with a greeting from Shari Guinta, National's president followed by three presenters.

The first, Barbara Renaud, is an educated advocate in the fight against human trafficking. She shared her experience with writing the archived resolution, 2012.01 – Criminalization of the Purchasing of Sexual Services. She presented it at the diocesan, provincial and national conventions and spoke with her local MP. In 2013 the government created The Protection of Communities and Exploited Persons Act, Bill C-36. In 2017 she wrote a second resolution, 2017.02 Mandatory Age Verification Mechanisms for Adult Pornographic Websites. https://shorturl.at/hoyu6 Barbara encouraged us to take some action to address human trafficking in our society.

The second presenter, Glendyne Gerrard shared that over 50 percent of those who are trafficked are Indigenous women. Glendyne is the founder of Defend Dignity, (<u>https://defenddignity.ca/)</u>. Defend Dignity acts as a catalyst for individuals and churches to end all forms of sexual exploitation through aid, awareness and advocacy.

The third presenter, Trisha Baptie was a victim of trafficking from the age of 13 to 28. She founded EVE, Formerly Exploited Voices Now Educating, (<u>https://educating-voices.com/new/</u>)

### World Day of Prayer 2025 – Friday, March 7<sup>th</sup>

Hosted by St. James Presbyterian Church, 280 Oxford Street, London

World Day of Prayer, a global Christian movement, began in the United States in the late 1800s and expanded to Canada in the 1920s, as Christian women became increasingly involved in missions both at home and abroad. Today, this event is celebrated in over 170 countries around the world.

We invite all members of our parishes to join in this interdenominational celebration, standing in prayer alongside women around the world and in our own community.
