



The Place of Silence in the Liturgy

During this Jubilee Year of Hope, Bishop Fabbro has asked us, as a diocese, to reexamine the way we celebrate Mass so this week and next, we will take a look at a couple important issues that the Church reemphasized when the Roman Missal was revised in 2011: silence in the Liturgy and liturgical posture- when to sit, stand and kneel and why it is important that we are doing the same things.

The Church gives us silence in liturgy to train our hearts and minds in silent prayer. As we cultivate silence, we will begin,

more frequently, to hear the voice of the Lord. Silence amplifies the reality of what we experience. Silence is a proper response to a reality which words cannot express—in the case of the Mass, to the reality of God's presence.

We are invited to silence several times during the Mass:

Penitential Act: There should be a brief pause after, "let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries" to allow us to recall the attitudes, actions, and omissions that separate us from God and our dependence on God's mercy.

Opening Collect: A period of silence follows the invitation, "Let us pray" giving us the opportunity to gather ourselves, what we bring to the liturgy, and to offer our silent intentions that we have discerned in the silence before Mass began.

Liturgy of the Word: After the first and second reading, the Gospel, and the homily, silence allows us to grasp the sense of what was proclaimed and internalize it so as to better respond to the prompting of the Holy Spirit. The period of silence is a time when the Lord can make alive the word proclaimed.

After Communion: The Church says that sacred silence be observed for some time after all have received communion before the Prayer after Communion to meditate and contemplate what we have received in the Eucharist.

Silence is an opportunity for greater participation for all of us to actively offer our prayers and more deeply absorb the word of God.

Land Acknowledgment in the Diocese of London

"A Land Acknowledgement can be a recognition of the unique, enduring, historical and ancestral relationship that exists between Indigenous Peoples and their traditional territories; a relationship involving the land, the climate and the creatures upon it. It can be an expression of appreciation to those on whose ancestral territory we reside; and a way of honouring those who have cared for the land from ancient times, not as owners but as good stewards. It reminds us that all are connected to one another, to nature and to the Creator who fashioned us all.

A Land Acknowledgement can also be a means for expressing our desire for peace among all peoples, and a starting point in our efforts to gain a richer and deeper understanding of Indigenous history and culture. It can be an expression of our willingness to overcome the systemic injustices that have occurred in our country, and a clear statement that we wish to know the truth that will ultimately lead to reconciliation." The Diocese of London, in consultation with the Truth & Reconciliation Committee has created a common Land Acknowledgement that will now be used through the Diocese. This will be used at four particular weekend Masses through the year and the opening meeting of the pastoral year for groups and committees.

Welcome, Father Patrick Bénéteau!

In July we welcomed Fr. Patrick Bénéteau as a priest in residence in our rectory. Many of you have had an opportunity to meet him over the summer. He will continue to be present at Mass on weekends in our Family.



We asked Fr. Patrick to share a bit about himself:

"I grew up not far from Windsor, Ontario, in the village of River Canard (Rivière-aux-Canards); the oldest of three children, our family was actively involved in the life of Paroisse St. Joseph Parish. After high school, I completed an apprenticeship program in the tool and mold industry as a machinist and moldmaker; during that time, I began to grow in my faith and began discerning a call to the priesthood.

Following studies at St. Peter's Seminary, I was ordained to the priesthood in April, 2010. Since that time I have had the privilege of being Associate Pastor at St. Michael Parish, Leamington (2010-2015), Director of Vocations & Seminarians for the Diocese of London (2015-2019), and Pastor of the Windsor-Lake St. Clair Catholic Family of Parishes from 2019-2023. For the past two years, I studied Canon Law at St. Paul's University, Ottawa, obtaining a licentiate degree in order to now serve the Diocese of London as Vice-Chancellor, Assistant Judge, and to help teach Canon Law at our Seminary.

I am very grateful to be welcomed as a priest in residence in the London North Central Catholic Family Parishes. Be assured of my prayers for all of you, and I hope we have a chance to meet one another in the coming weeks!"
