

Did You Know

The **Cruciform** is the area in front of the Sanctuary. There are four painting on the life of St. Peter. The two paintings on the **east side** depict the following:

- St. Peter being crucified upside down by his request. He felt he was not worthy of being crucified upright like Christ since he denied Christ three times.
- 2. St. Peter in jail and an Angel is freeing him from his bonds: "a miraculous deliverance".

The two painting on the **west side** depict the following:

- 1. St. Peter healing a man (from the Acts of The Apostles).
- 2. St. Peter trying to walk on water and sinking. Jesus saves him.
- 3. The paintings on the ceiling over the Cruciform in the form of a cross, depict the fact this is the Cruciform of the Cathedral and the connection between Heaven and earth.


