#### Remain in my Word (John 8.31) Sunday of the Word of God

"Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter at the conclusion of the Jubilee of Mercy, desired that "every Christian community, on one Sunday of the liturgical year, could renew its efforts to make the Sacred Scriptures better known and more widely diffused. It would be a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people" (Misericordia et misera, 7). With the Apostolic Letter Aperuit illis, Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God, arranging its celebration on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time.



It should not be overlooked that the Sunday of the Word of God takes place at a time when the Church celebrates the Day of Dialogue Introduction between Jews and Catholics and the Week of Christian Unity, giving it great ecumenical and communion significance. Indeed, Sacred Scripture has always been a bridge of dialogue and important contact with other Christian denominations and religions as well. In addition, the Gospels on this Sunday, in all three liturgical cycles, relate the beginning of the ministry and preaching of Jesus, the Word made flesh. It is a profoundly pastoral initiative with which Pope Francis wants to make it clear how important it is in the daily life of the Church and our communities to refer to the Word of God, a Word that is not confined to a book, but which remains ever alive and becomes a concrete and tangible sign.


The Sunday of the Word of God allows Christians to reinvigorate once again Jesus' tenacious invitation to listen to and cherish his Word, in order to offer the world a witness of hope that will enable them to move beyond the difficulties of the present moment. In the journey Pope Francis is asking the whole Church to take toward the Jubilee of 2025, whose motto is Pilgrims of Hope, the Sunday of the Word of God becomes a crucial step. Indeed, the hope that flows from this Word prompts every community not only to proclaim the same faith as always, but above all to communicate it with the conviction that it brings hope to those who hear and welcome it with a simple heart."

# MAiD Presentation Compassion, Suffering and Medical Assistance in Dying: In the Context of Faith

Presenters: Marleen Van Laethem, BSc, MHSc, Clinical Ethicist, St. Joseph Health Care, London; and Fr. Jason Kuntz, Bioethics Professor, St. Peter's Seminary

Medically assisted death is a serious moral issue facing our society and raises important questions for people of faith. Known as MAiD, it is a process that allows someone, who is found eligible, to receive assistance from a medical practitioner to end their life.

Informed by a theology of suffering, we will reflect on what the Church teaches about medically assisted death and endof-life care.

Our guest speakers will also give us a clear understanding of how MAiD works. We will learn the current legal requirements to access an assisted death. As well, we will explore how requirements to qualify for MAiD have changed since 2016 and what further changes are planned for March 2024. The ethical guidelines for Catholic hospitals and doctors will be discussed.


#### PRE-AUTHORIZED GIVING (P.A.G.) PLAN

In 3 easy steps, you will be able to set up your PAG Plan:

- Complete the PAG enrolment form. Ask us for a paper copy or click on your parish for an e-copy: <u>St. Peter's</u> or <u>St. Michael's</u>.
- Determine the amount of your monthly pledge. This will be the amount to be deducted from your bank account as your regular offertory. (E.g. weekly amount x 52 weeks / 12 months \$5 weekly offering = \$22 monthly; \$10 weekly = \$43 monthly; \$20 weekly = \$87 monthly)
- 3. Mail in a VOID cheque to the parish office or take a photo of it and upload via the online PAG form.

The Year of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood in our Diocese began last year, Pentecost 2023. One of the initiatives is the Called by Name process that stresses the role of the Christian community in calling forth men to consider this vocation. Parishioners throughout the Diocese are encouraged to consider who in their midst might serve well as a priest.

What should one look for in a candidate to Priesthood? The following qualities are desirable in persons identified as potential candidates:

A person of prayer who loves the Lord

A person who considers a personal relationship with God as an important part of life

A person who has an ability and willingness to take about his faith life

A person who is will willing to sacrifice personal or material gain for the service of the Gospel and the Church

A person who is actively involved in the life of the Church

A person who has a desire to serve others and make a difference in people's lives

A person who is successful in life, including school, work, relationships

A person who engages others, is approachable, enjoys life, people and has a sense of humour

A person who has the ability to lead and work with people of all ages

A person who forms and maintains healthy relationships with men and women

A person with personal integrity, honesty, generosity
