# **MATT'S MUSINGS:**Addressing Our Religious Respectfully

I was chatting with an acquaintance that I'll call "Bill" recently. We were discussing others who might be joining us and Bill indicated that he thought "Frank" might come. I thought for a moment and when I couldn't think of who "Frank" was, I asked. The answer surprised me. Bill was referring to our Deacon, Deacon Frank to me.

Bill explained that he and Deacon Frank go way back.

Most know that my past life was as a litigation lawyer. Most may not know that when a lawyer enters or leaves a courtroom, or approaches a Judge, the Judge is to be bowed to. It is not the judge that is being respected (although he/she is) but his/her office.



I was a lawyer long enough and was smart enough in hiring young lawyers, that some of our Judges today used to work for me. If I meet these Judges in public or refer to them to a third party, I address them as Justice ...... If I am fortunate enough to interact with them privately, then I do refer to them by their first name. (Assuming they are still speaking to me)

When a Catholic man becomes a Deacon, Priest, Bishop or Pope, while they continue to be the man that they were, they also become so much more. Additionally, they enter a position that demands the utmost respect from all of us. Referring to our former Pope as "Francis" or our Bishop as "Fabbro" for whatever reason is disrespectful.

Unless you are in private with the Deacon/Priest and he has indicated that he prefers you to address him by his first name, it is just as disrespectful not to call him Deacon/Father. They are, after all, Jesus' representatives on earth. How hard is it to give them the proper respect?

Regardless of our personal feelings for any of our Religious, whether enmity or friendship, the position they occupy commands respect and we as Catholics, and especially as Knights, need to show it.

We must also remember that people imitate each other, especially those that they think know what they are doing. Someone new to the Parish may think Deacon Frank is to be called "Frank" and start doing the same, worsening the issue.

As soon as a Catholic man becomes a man of God, whether Deacon, Priest, Bishop or Pope, he becomes the focus of intense attacks from Satan. Especially with our priests, Satan knows that without them we have no Eucharist. And, as St. Padre Pio said "It is easier for the earth to exist without the sun than without the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass."

As a Deacon/Priest, he needs our prayers. He isn't just one of the boys any more. His position, and he, need our prayers, support and love. And, he needs to know he has them. The least we can do is honour him with his proper title. Their position comes at a cost we cannot begin to imagine.

It is important for ourselves, as well, to show proper respect. "That's just Charles, my bud." rather than "That's Father Charles my priest" invokes a whole different mindset. Think about it. We'll act differently. And, we should.

It goes without saying that the above is equally applicable to all women who become nuns.
