He has offered to bring monetary donations directly to the Knight's of Columbus council in Lviv. I will be bringing this up at out General Meeting.

Letter from Brother Rafal Schubert

As per our conversation, I am going to Ukraine around the 20th of May. I will be in Lviv, where I have seen multiple postings about the council in Lviv on the official KofC social media account. If the district councils or the state would like to make a monetary donation, I am more than happy to do so in person. I can make the contacts with them and confirm donations.



Background: On the 1st of March 2022, as a result of the Invasion of Ukraine, the London Ukrainian Centre became the community lead in focusing humanitarian aid

from the City of London. The effort has to this day provided 60 metric tons of aid directly to Ukraine. Above the international aid, LUC gave rise to a non-profit organization, London Ukrainian Humanitarian Action. LUHA went on and became the London Area leader in supporting housing, food security, legal assistance, medical coordination, and adaptive advocacy for those impacted by the crisis in Ukraine.

The group directly supports all newcomers and International Students in the London Area. LUC and LUHA continue their efforts.

Our last donation was a 53' sea container destined for Ukraine. The container was filled with vital materials for an orphanage in need and critical medical supplies in conflict areas. Our council's \$500 donations directly supported this container.

I am going over as part of a Logistics team designated to build partnerships and establish the most effective routes for our distribution.

One of my favourite Gospel readings after Easter is the story of those who were walking to Emmaus, fully disheartened by all that had happened. You can read it in Luke 24.13-35. We can resonate with the two travellers because we too

sometimes fail to grasp the connection between events and what happens to us. When something happens that we don't understand we naturally feel perplexed, wondering if there is any reason in these and other events. When we find ourselves in that situation Saint Luke would respond that there's a plan and that God plays a part in all of this. Ultimately this episode challenges us to trust in the God who as they say writes straight with crooked lines. The God who saw through his plan for his Son will do no less for us.

Along the way Jesus helps them to understand the meaning of his suffering, death and resurrection.

Of course, it describes the disciples' journey but also their progression from despair to incredible joy when they recognize the Risen Lord at the breaking of the bread. This can happen - it does happen to us...- every time we gather for the Eucharist – we recognize him here among us at the table and in the Word - when we read and pray with Scripture in private

- every time we accompany someone or let someone accompany us on our faith journey. We talk about the joys and sorrows of life and when we add the dimension of faith we discover where Jesus is in all of it

Walking with Jesus – however it is for us - will always transform us. We encounter him. it is about love and inspires hope and joy. And that we are to pass on to others.
